

EHT Fund Assistance

What is Emma Harper Turner (EHT) Fund Assistance?

The EHT Fund provides financial assistance to collegiate and alumnae members experiencing a financial crisis. Restrictions and eligibility criteria apply.

Who qualifies for EHT Fund Assistance?

Any collegiate or alumnae member in good standing.

What kind of assistance is available?

- For collegiate members, one-time educational grants are available, made payable to their university or college.
- For alumnae members, one-time grants are available.
- For collegiate or alumnae members affected by and living in a presidentially-declared disaster area, one-time grants are available.

How would I get or help my Pi Phi sister get EHT Fund assistance?

The Foundation has a confidential process in place to assist members who need financial assistance. A brief application is required, as well as one to three recommendations from other Pi Phi members in good standing. The number and types of recommendations varies depending on the kind of assistance requested. Visit www.pibetaphifoundation.org/apply/emma-harper-turner-grants to get started.

Is it confidential?

The Emma Harper Turner Fund program at Pi Beta Phi Foundation is completely confidential, outside of the trusted Pi Phi sisters who provide recommendations for your application. Only the applicant and the EHT committee sees EHT applications. Even Board of Trustee approval is done 'blind' with application numbers, not specific names. Your confidentiality is protected at every step.
